In implantology new technology propels the development of better diagnostic tools, bone materials, surgical techniques, implant systems, and prosthetic options. But often lost in the pursuit of technological advancement are the basic tenants for implant success. The Five “C” Concept is my way of approaching implant dentistry treatment planning, surgery, and restoration. As an Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon for nearly 29 years, I have experienced both success and failure in every aspect of surgical implant dentistry. The implant dentist who is armed with a firm foundation of implant concepts will always be successful, no matter how implant dentistry evolves. This discussion will focus on implant treatment of the anterior maxillary incisor teeth and provide clear guidance for making smart choices without falling into the typical traps that lead to failure.

He entered the private practice of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery in 2011 and currently practices full-time at Oral Surgery South in Norwell, Massachusetts. He is Past-President of the Massachusetts Society of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons (MSOMS) and currently serves on the Executive Board, Continuing Education Committee, and as Senior Delegate to the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons (AAOMS) for Massachusetts. He is a past Section Editor of the Parameters of Care for Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery as well as a past member of the Committee on Continuing Education for AAOMS. He has a research background and has published extensively on many topics in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. He has extensive experience lecturing to dentists, surgeons and students at various local, national and international venues and meetings on the topics of bone grafting and implant treatment. He is currently on staff at Franciscans Children's Hospital, Norwood Hospital, and Dartmouth-Hitchcock Cheshire Medical Center.
